

MINUTES OF BOARD OF EDUCATION MEETING
Homewood-Flossmoor High School, 999 Kedzie Avenue, Flossmoor, Illinois
September 20, 2011

Mr. Lites called the meeting to order at 7:35 p.m. The following board members were present for all or part of the meeting:

The presence of a quorum was noted and the meeting declared duly convened. Superintendent Mansfield, Principal Pitcock, Curriculum & Instruction Director Spaniak, Human Resources Director Bryant, and Business Manager Parchem were also present.

Representatives from the Southtown Star, HFEO, HFPA and League of Women Voters were also present.

Approval of Minutes. Mrs. Scariano moved, seconded by Mrs. Sutton, that the Board of Education approve the minutes of the regular meeting of August 16, 2011. Roll Call: Ayes – Dr. Farrell, Mr. Lindstrom, Dr. Mayer, Mrs. McInerney-Lubeck, Mrs. Scariano, Mrs. Sutton, Mr. Lites. Nays – None. Motion carried.

Comments. Reverend Doyle Landry, a member of the audience, addressed the board. Reverend Landry referred to an article that appeared in the Chicago Tribune on August 31, 2011, titled *Public School Grads Struggle at College*. He expressed his concern regarding the resilience of future college students, particularly African-American males. The article reports that new data shows GPAs decline markedly, raising questions about whether students are prepared for demands of higher education. He stated he is here tonight because of his concern for students who think they have every “I” dotted and every “T” crossed, leaving high school with a good GPA and then not making it once they get to college. He added retention rates at universities are a real issue now. Reverend Landry recommended that the board take a look at the article and consider conducting a similar analysis of the high school and implement ways to improve upon the analysis of the data. Dr. Mansfield stated our curriculum is aligned to the College Readiness Standards. Relative to GPA, initiatives are in place and discussions continue for helping students who are at the low end as well as the high end. One of the things we pride ourselves in at H-F is that we have initiatives in place to help students across the board who are at different levels. We have made and continue to make a concerted effort at analyzing data from various standardized tests. Mr. Lites thanked Reverend Landry for sharing his thoughts and attending tonight’s meeting. Mr. Lites added we are always mindful that we can improve. Mrs. Scariano added and we have improved and continue to improve. Mr. Lites asked Reverend Landry to provide his contact information to Dr. Mansfield.

Mr. Khalid Finley, a member of the audience and Class of 93 H-F alumni, addressed the board. Mr. Finley suggested inviting former H-F students experiencing success in college to return to H-F and speak to current students about their college experiences. Mr. Lites noted each year we have had former AP Scholars come back and speak with some of our highest achieving students. Dr. Mansfield asked Dr. Pitcock to speak with Mr. Schmidt, Department Chair of Guidance, regarding Mr. Finley’s suggestion. Mrs. McInerney-Lubeck added we are currently in the process of developing an Alumni Association and stated that perhaps the Alumni Association could assist in sponsoring exactly what Mr. Finley is suggesting.

Dr. Pitcock expressed his congratulations to Greg Petecki who was awarded the honor of Illinois Secondary Art Educator of the Year through the Illinois Arts Education Association (IAEA). Mr. Petecki will be honored at an award banquet in November. The Children’s play, *How I Became a Pirate*, begins this weekend. The children’s play is always a favorite of the community. Homecoming just finished and all the Homecoming events were very successful. Dr. Pitcock added in terms of culture and climate, he is very proud of where we are and proud of our students and community.

Mr. Lindstrom stated many people in his age category attend the football games to socialize and converse. Unfortunately it is sometime difficult to hear while speaking to others. The new sound system

Comments (con't) sounds great and you now hear everything. For those of us in social situations with loud backgrounds it does make a difference. Mr. Lindstrom suggested bringing the volume down. Mr. Lindstrom referred to the vandalism that occurred here last night. To think someone on roller blades broke the windows of the school, you just wonder what they are thinking. To know all the good things that are going on here, and then one person tries to take that away. He said it is very sad when this type of incident occurs.

Mrs. McInerney-Lubeck commented that she loved getting a copy of the new yearbook and it is another reminder of our number one ranking in the state because of the journalism team. She extended her congratulations to the staff involved in the production of the yearbook.

Dr. Farrell stated he wanted to thank his fellow board members who met until 2:30 in the morning on September 12th. He added it reminds him of the many constructive things that volunteers do and he really does appreciate the efforts of the board members. He commented that the new teacher dinner that took place was very well attended. People were really having a good time and there was a lot of energy in the room. He noted people were just not leaving and there were a lot of excited young teachers and added he enjoyed being there.

Mr. Lites expressed his thanks to all the board for their attendance during the September 12th special meeting. It was a long night and your commitment is what keeps me propped up and I appreciate it and it is heartfelt. The community is lucky to have each and every one of you.

Mr. Lindstrom, stated members of the Finance Committee, along with administrators, met with the Fitch group to talk to them in terms of improving our current bond rating. Our current rating with Fitch is AA-. We feel there are so many things to reevaluate and we requested right up front that we are worthy of a AAA rating. He added if you look at what this high school does, compared to the rest of the state, we certainly deserve a AAA rating. We not only are entrusted with educating our students but we are also accountable to our taxpayers. So we have asked Fitch to take another look at us and give us the AAA rating. During the meeting we had an opportunity to discuss the many good things we are doing here. Mr. Lites extended his compliments to the Finance Committee and added the committee does a wonderful job of monitoring tax dollars. He stated he would love to see AAA rating. Mr. Lites noted the current AA-rating is a very, very good one and if we would have to issue new debt we would be given the very lowest rates. He agreed we definitely deserve a AAA rating given the way we have managed our money from the 2002 referendum. The group did an excellent job in the ratings call and it was very well done.

Mrs. McInerney-Lubeck stated the Planning Committee met early this morning. A new policy on concussions was reviewed and will be on tonight's agenda. The new policy will also be available on our website. Discussion took place regarding the Gifted Academy. She stated Dr. Pitcock and Mrs. Spaniak have done a great job with getting the Academy off and running. There are 66 students enrolled and they seem to be doing very well. In addition the committee talked a little bit about getting a fine arts center built adjacent to the theater section which would give us the opportunity for a Fine Arts Academy. The committee also talked a little about implementing a success academy to infuse some social and emotional learning skills to assist lower achieving students. The November 4th Institute Day was also discussed. Mrs. Spaniak highlighted the agenda for the day.

Adoption of Budget Resolution. Mr. Lindstrom moved, seconded by Mrs. Scariano, that the Board of Education adopt the Budget Resolution for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2012, as recommended by the Finance Committee, the Business Manager, and the Superintendent. Dr. Mansfield offered his thanks to Mr. Parchem and noted this is the ninth consecutive year that the district will operate with a surplus budget. Mr. Parchem stated school code requires the budget be passed by September 30th. Mr. Parchem explained that this is a culmination of a long process that began back in February. The tentative budget was discussed with the Finance Committee in August. Mr. Parchem added this is also the seventh consecutive year the district has received the highest honor of financial recognition from the state based on its 2010 school year financial data. The district received a 4.0, the highest possible score. That distinction, coupled with the Standard & Poor's AA+ rating further demonstrates that H-F is a financially sound district. There are still financial challenges as we move forward due to the slow economy and condition of the state of Illinois, but we are managing better than most districts. Proper planning, forward thinking, being fiscally conservative and staying on course is something we are extremely proud of. 2011-2012 Interfund Transfer. Mr. Lindstrom moved, seconded by Mrs. Scariano, that the Board of Education adopt the Budget Resolution authorizing an interfund transfer in the amount of \$10 million from the Education Fund to the Operations & Maintenance Fund as recommended by the Finance Committee, the Business Manager and the Superintendent. Mr. Parchem stated the money was redirected for future use and added that a focus group has been formed to look at various options for facility improvements. 2011 Ford F250 Pickup/Snowplow. Mrs. Sutton moved, seconded by Mrs. Scariano, that the Board of Education approve the purchase of a 2011 Ford F250 4x4 Pickup with Western 8 foot ProPlow Accessory Package through the State of Illinois Joint Purchasing Program contract #PSD-4014998 in the amount of \$32,289 as recommended by the Business Manager and the Superintendent. Roll Call: Ayes – Dr. Mayer, Mrs. McInerney-Lubeck, Mrs. Scariano, Mrs. Sutton, Dr. Farrell, Mr. Lindstrom, Mr. Lites. Nays – None. Motion carried.

Application for Recognition of Schools. Mrs. McInerney-Lubeck moved, seconded by Mrs. Scariano, that the Board of Education approve the 2011-2012 Application for Recognition of Schools and authorize the Superintendent to forward it to the Suburban Cook County Regional Office of Education, as recommended by the Superintendent and the Superintendent. Dr. Mansfield explained that this is an annual application in which we certify to the State Board of Education that we are following Illinois School Code. In addition, because of the No Child Left Behind, the application requires us to list all of our instructional assistants and confirm that they are all qualified for their positions. November 4, 2011 Institute. Mrs. McInerney-Lubeck moved, seconded by Mrs. Scariano, that the Board of Education authorize the Superintendent to submit the program request for the November 4, 2011, Institute to the Suburban Cook County Regional Office of Education, as recommended by the Planning Committee, the Director of Curriculum, Instruction & Professional Development and the Superintendent. Mrs. Spaniak explained the November Institute will follow the same format as the August Institute. The agenda allows time for teachers to be trained in the Courtney Strategies followed by department specific workshop trainings and activities. There will also be time for PLC teams to meet together. Policy 6521, Concussions and Head Injuries: Students and Student Athletes Policy. Mrs. McInerney-Lubeck moved, seconded by Mrs. Scariano, that the Board of Education amend Policy 6521, Concussions and Head Injuries: Students and Student Athletes Policy, as recommended by the School Attorney, the Planning Committee and the Superintendent. Dr. Mansfield explained this is a new policy regarding concussion protocol as a result of Governor Quinn signing it into law this summer. He added the policy that has been put in place will cover athletes as well as everyone present in the school's buildings and campus.
