SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

- 1. African-American student with a demonstrated financial need, attending school and residing in the South Suburban Chicago area;
- 2. Currently enrolled in senior year of high school;
- 3. Cumulative unweighted GPA of 2.7 or higher;
- 4. Provide two letters of recommendation: one <u>must</u> be from a teacher; the second recommendation can be from a teacher or any other school staff member; and
- 5. Must be accepted to an accredited four-year college or university for the 2024-2025 school year. Acceptance to a two-year college will also be considered.

APPLICATION SUBMISSION CHECKLIST

All documents, including supporting materials, must be sent via email to scholarship@jackandjillsscc.com. The application must be received on or before Saturday, March 30, 2024. Late applications will not be considered. Information provided will be maintained confidentially and used for purposes stated for this initiative only. - 2. Attach an essay, 500 words or less for **one** of the following questions:
 - * Discuss an accomplishment, event, idea, concept, or realization that sparked a period of personal growth and a new understanding of yourself or others;
 - * What do you feel are the most significant issues facing the world today? Why?; and
 - * How you plan to make a difference in the world?
- 3. Attach two Letters of Recommendation: one <u>must</u> be from a teacher; the second recommendation can be from a teacher or any other school staff member;
- 4. Attach an official copy of your high school transcript.
